5 Preschool at Anlong Thom

January 2017 saw the official opening of our preschool in Anlong Thom, which was officiated by Kim Wilson. The preschool is play based and operates for 2 hours each day. SIM's Cambodia Inc supports the wages of the preschool teacher and a primary school teacher, provides resources for both the preschool and the primary school and provides regular food relief packages, clothing drops, mosquito nets, blankets and thongs for the village.

In July Brian accompanied Srey Nit, who comes from the impoverished village of Prey Thom, to Battambang University where, with the help of sponsors, she will enrol in the Bachelor of Education degree. This will enable her to have a future away from the poverty of her village.

Brian also visited the village of Kon Seng where we have been asked to build a 6 Srey Nit with Brian at Battambang Library and a new classroom for the village. We would also like to begin payment University of wages for Teacher Sochea Ne who currently volunteers.

To provide for these communities your assistance is sought. The Library will cost \$1700 to build, the new classroom \$5000. Sochea Ne's wages for the year would be \$1620 (\$135 per month). To resource both schools for the year (Anlong Thom and Kon Seng) we would expect to pay \$700. This would cover exercise books, pens, pencils, text books and some readers. We purchase these items in Siem Reap as they are too bulky to transport from here. The Library would require shelving and books.

Any support would be gratefully appreciated. Brian and I are only too happy to come to your school at any stage and speak with the staff or students about our work in Cambodia.

If Principal's are happy to have us set up a small table in the staffroom with goods that we sell to help with fundraising, please email us. We have a stall each month at Maitland Markets but other than that rely on donations from friends, family and schools to provide for everything we do in Cambodia.
